11:00 AM	Pete Leach	Make-and-Take Scenery Backdrop Painting	Pete has developed a very effective way of creating realistic scenery backdrops. In his clinic, Pete will guide eight participants in using his techniques, and each will go home with a small section of scenery back-drop in their possession. Kids 8 and older are welcome to participate! They must be accompanied with a parent or adult guardian.
11:00 AM	Gene Mangum	Realistically Assembling Kits, Kit Bashing, and Scratchbuilding Structures	Gene Mangum has a beautiful model railroad inspired by the Southern Pacific in the Hill Country from San Antonio to Kerrville. He has very effectively assembled kits, kitbashed, and scratchbuilt structures on his layout, which is one of the most realistic you will ever see. Gene's presentation covers some of these structures as he explains how he went about creating them and their settings on a layout designed for operation.
1:00 PM	Bob Barnett, Master Model Railroader	Over the River and Through the Woods	Bob Barnett will give an updated presentation of his clinic concerning the Missouri Pacific's circuitous route from Spring to Fort Worth, including the Southern Pacific's now-abandoned Neleva Cut-Off. The clinic will include new information he has come across on this route.
1:00 PM	Tom Bailey	Passenger Operations in Kansas City	Kansas City was one of the few large cities where all its passenger trains served a single large union station—in KC's case, twelve railroads and dozens of trains. Tom Bailey will cover the main trains as well as the more quaint and lesser-known ones. St. Louis was known as the "Gateway to the West", but perhaps Kansas City, closer to where the West truly starts, is more deserving of that moniker.
2:30 PM	Shane Wilson of Scale Trains	Meet and Greet	Scale Trains is a manufacturer of HO scale, N scale, and S scale model trains. In this presentation, Shane Wilson will share the story of his company, and how they go about manufacturing model trains. He will answer any questions attendees have. There will be free giveaways, such as hats and shirts. Scale Rails also has three tables in the train show.
2:30 PM	Richard Louvet	Stacked Staging	The downsizing of Richard Louvet's layout presented the problem of where to locate a staging yard. Dick's clinic covers an innovative solution to the problem using off-the-shelf components to create an automated train elevator. The clinic will include a demonstration.
